This has been a very traumatic experience! You are most likely overwhelmed with trying to put your life back together. This letter is to make sure you are aware of available services and a few very important steps.

The first step is to contact the Williamson County (WC) American Red Cross and register with them as someone who was impacted by the tornado. Your contact person is Susan Shreve, (615) 790-5785. If your residence was damaged in the storms, you might be eligible to receive:

- Limited stay in hotel
- First month's rent
- Western Williamson County Tornado Relief Funds
- Please sign release form so all agencies can help assist you

The amount of assistance is determined and based on reviewing each case individually. Additional services:
